Q1. How do I find information about Non-Traditional Instructional (NTI) Lessons?

A. If you go the National Trail Website at <u>www.nationaltrail.k12oh.us</u>, you can find up to date information on the NTI lessons and news relating to the school closure. Once on the webpage, simply click on "District" tab then the "Online Learning Information" tab.

Q2. What if I do not have internet services to access the NTI Lessons?

A. There are a number of internet providers who are running specials for families with students.

If these options do not work, hard copies of assignments can be arranged for pick-up. Please contact your student's teacher to coordinate work to be picked-up at National Trail, Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m.

Q3. What if I still need a device for my student?

A. Students/Parents may make arrangements to pick-up a device. Simply email your building principal or call the office to make arrangements.

Q4. What do I do if I have borrowed a device from the school and it is not working?

A. Tech support will be available from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday. Tech support is located just inside Door #1.

Students should bring the device and charger with them. You may also call 937-234-7326 for phone support.

Q5. When are NTI lesson assignments due? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. NTI Lesson due dates vary by class and grade. Please check with your student's teacher to ensure that the proper turn-in date is not missed. Typically, Friday is a great day to make-up all missing assignments.

While I'm sure we can agree, this is not the way we prefer to educate our students. It is imperative that students keep working and turn in their class assignments to ensure they have the needed skills for their future learning or life activities.

Q6. Where do I turn in hard copy assignments? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. If your child has completed hard copy assignments, please take a picture of the completed work and email it to the teacher. If you are unable to take pictures of the completed work, please email the teacher and bring the work to the building and place it in the "completed work" tub at Door #1. Each building principal will make sure the work is given to the proper teacher. Please



make sure your student's name is properly identified on the work when it is turned in at the school. Door #1 is open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Monday – Friday.

We ask for patience when returning work due to the cleaning process that we have put in place to return the work to our staff members. We want to make sure we follow proper safety procedures for all aspects of this pandemic.

Q7. Who should I contact with any question regarding assignments/lessons? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. If you have questions pertaining to assignments/lessons, please contact your child's teacher(s). Teachers are required to be accessible to students/parents via email from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. daily during the course of each week.

If you are not receiving school work, please reach out to your child's teacher or the school to gather needed materials so your students is not behind as we move further ahead.

Q9. What if I don't receive a response from a teacher?

A. Teachers are required to be accessible to students/parents via email daily from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. NT Staff will make every effort to respond in a timely manner during these days and time frame. If you do not receive a response within 24hrs, please email the building principal.

Q10. My child is either not sure how to communicate with her/his teachers regarding assignments or we have not heard anything from my child's teacher regarding assignments. Who should we contact?



A. Your child's teacher(s) should be in communication with you and/or your child through various forms of digital communication. Please ask your child to check his/her school issued email account or classroom app.

Q11. What if I call the school building offices and/or the District Offices and I do not get an answer? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. Please start by checking our National Trail Local School website at www.nationaltrail.k12.oh.us. From there you will be able to access frequently asked question (which will be updated as additional questions are received) and information regarding the Coronavirus. If you do not find the answer to your question, we will have individuals in the building offices periodically. When someone is in the office, they will answer the phone. If no one answers, please leave a message AND e-mail the teacher/building principal with the reason you called.

If you call the District Office, we ask you to follow the same procedure. If you call the District Office and no one answers, please leave a message and email Bob Fischer at bfischer@nationaltrail.us.

Please remember that due to current stay at home order, we are running on limited office hours, but all calls will be returned in no less than 24 HRS.

Q14. What if I am an essential worker and need child care during the day.



A. National Trail has been made aware that Panther's Prep in Lewisburg, Imagination Station in Eaton, and Bright Beginnings in Eaton are accepting children of essential workers. Parents should contact these day cares prior to dropping off children.

Q15. What does the extended closure of schools for the rest of the academic year mean for students? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. Students will continue to receive remote lessons through their teacher(s) on Monday through Thursday. Students should check their school issued email address or classroom app for additional communication from teachers. Fridays are established "catch-up" days and NO new lessons will be assigned on these days.

Q16. What is the "school" schedule thru the end of the academic school year? (UPDATED 5/4/20)

Each week, students will follow the same schedule:

- Monday Thursday will be NTI Lessons
- Friday will be a student catch-up day, enrichment day, teacher planning and student/parent contact day

The official announcement from the governor that we will not have in-person instruction for the rest of this year will alter the ending of the 2019-2020 school year. The last weeks of school are typically filled with exams, celebrations, and recognitions that we will unfortunately not be able to have this year; therefore, our last day of new instruction will be Thursday, May 14th.

- The expectation is that the majority of student work is completed by May 15th.
- If there is an issue with completing assignments by May 15th, please contact your child's teacher.
- ALL work must be turned in by 8:00am on May 28th

Please understand, we are NOT ending the school year early. We have made this decision in order for students to successfully complete the school year. The final days without new assignments will allow students to catch up and close out the semester.

Q17. Will the senior class participate in a graduation ceremony? (UPDATED 5/4/20)

A. It is our intention, that qualifying National Trail High School seniors will have the opportunity to participate in a graduation ceremony. Based on the information we have at this time, we are STILL planning the regularly scheduled graduation ceremony on June 5_{th} @ 7:00p.

- Graduation Practice (Mandatory) June 5th @ 10:00a at the NT Football Field
- To enforce social distancing, only 4 guests per student will be permitted and will be asked to sit in designated areas. We ask that young children please stay home.
- A livestream of the commencement ceremony will be available.



• Potential Dates, if we need to keep pushing the event further back due to the COVID-19 Pandemic or weather would be Saturday, June 6th, Friday, June 19th or Saturday, June 20th

Q18. Will the Junior/Senior Prom still be held? (UPDATED 4/21/20)

A. It is our intention, regardless of the length of the school closure, that the Junior/Senior Prom will still take place. Based on the information we have at this time, our April 25th Prom date has been postponed, but National Trail is already working on several alternate dates.

Once we know the next steps from the Governor, we will start announcing alternate dates, if necessary. National Trail is currently looking at a mid-May or mid-June date to attempt to hold Prom. We do not want to put multiple dates out to the public in order to eliminate any possible confusion that may happen. We will make sure AMPLE time is given for families to plan summer events.

Q19. What is the status of the Class of 2024 Washington D.C. trip?

A. Based on the information received regarding the status of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the National Trail Local School District in conjunction with K&K Tours decided it is necessary to reschedule the Class of 2024 Washington D.C. Trip. After looking at all possible options, the week of November 15-19 appears to interfere the least with our students' very busy academic, extra-curricular, athletic and social calendars. Additionally, students traveling to Washington D.C. would have Friday, November 20th, off from school as well.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

All teachers, coaches, clubs and organizations will be made aware of student absence during the week of November 15th.

If you still plan for your son or daughter to travel with their classmates, nothing needs to be done at this time. We will plan on having a parent meeting in September concerning the trip and to complete the necessary paperwork.

At this point, NO refund policy is available from K & K unless you purchased trip insurance.

Q21. How is grading being handled at National Trail? (UPDATED 5/4/20)



As a district, National Trail Local Schools (NTLS) recognizes that remote learning is not an equal replacement to the learning experiences that take place in the classroom. While we are proud of what our teachers are accomplishing and grateful for what the students and their families are contributing, it just is not the same.

During the remaining weeks of the 2019-2020 school year, it is critical for our students to remain engaged in school to the best of their ability. The information collected during this learning will help our staff better analyze your student's growth and prepare the curriculum for the 2020-2021 academic school year. All of our students will still be earning grades during this time, and they must remain engaged in their classes to earn those grades. Student work should be submitted according to the due dates established by teachers. We will continue to accept all student work for credit up until the last official day of school (May 28, 2020)

National Trail Elementary (K-4th grade)

National Trail Elementary will use *Complete / Incomplete* for Non-Traditional Instruction (NTI) grades. Standards taught during online instruction will be the only indicators considered during this 4th quarter.

- If students turn in 60% of the work they receive a *Complete* on the report card.
- If they turn in less than 60% they received an *Incomplete* for the indicator.
- Students could receive an *Incomplete* on some indicators and *Complete* on others depending on work they turn in.

National Trail Middle School and High School (5th - 12th grades)

As a result of the closure of schools due to the CoVid-19 Pandemic, National Trail Local Schools (NTLS) understands that fourth quarter grading has been a concern for many. Due to a variety of reasons students may or may not have been able to complete assigned work. NTLS wants to follow the philosophy of "held harmless" so that student grades will not be negatively impacted due to a lack of access during NTI. Due to this, the following standards will be used for fourth quarter grades:

A student's fourth quarter grade will be calculated using one of the following formulas:

a. The average of the first three quarters will be counted as 75% of fourth quarter and the work completed / assigned during the NTI period will be the other 25%. ((Average of Quarters 1-3) x .75) + (NTI Grade x .25) = 4th quarter grade

OR

b. 4th Quarter grade if it is higher than option 1.

The higher of the two options will be taken as the fourth quarter grade.

Students taking CCP classes will be able to follow the guidelines listed above or the guidelines set by the respective university/college. Please contact the classroom teacher or Miss Egbert for any questions.

Be advised that K-12 grading may not be the same in the future,



even if we have similar virtual learning in 2020-2021 and beyond.

Q22. How can we return school property such as library books, iPads, laptops, textbooks, etc..? (UPDATED 5/10/20)

A. Textbooks, iPads, laptops and other school materials will be returned stating May 26th – May 28th from 1:00-7:00p This will also be the time where student personal belongings may be picked up.

Q23. When will the final 2019-2020 Report Cards be available? (ADDED 4/21/20)

A. National Trail report cards will be mailed home to families a week after the conclusion of the 2019-2020 school year on May 28, 2020.

Q24. When can students cleanout their lockers or pick-up personal belongings at the school? (UPDATED 5/10/20)

A. Textbooks, iPads, laptops and other school materials will be returned stating May 26_{th} – May 28_{th} from 1:00-7:00p This will also be the time where student personal belongings may be picked up.

A. The following information was provided by OHSAA's Executive Director on April 20, 2020:

As we have stated in our previous communications, today's announcement by Governor DeWine to close schools for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year also will now result in the cancellation of OHSAA sponsored spring sports seasons including tournaments.

Moving Forward



I want to stress the 'uncertainties,' but as we now look into the summer and the fall, we will communicate plans/adjustments to our regulations as uncertainties become realities. I want to assure you that we are looking at everything. For example, when the first decision to close schools was made, we looked at eligibility concerns. About three weeks ago we began looking at all models if fall sports' seasons were affected – still an uncertainty. We are looking at everything from 'physicals' (and the potential difficulty of getting them) to the possible need to treat/disinfect artificial surfaces. We will pass along guidance and regulation adjustments as uncertainties become better understood. We are drawing on a long-established OHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Group for professional recommendations for many of these concerns and issues. This is a reminder the current no-contact period remains in effect at least through May 3. Any adjustments/extension to this will be communicated in advance of that date. Ninety-four percent of current respondents to Friday's survey of member school administrators would expect this to be extended to June 1st.
