Equal Educational Opportunities

All students of the District have equal educational opportunities.

Students have the right to be free from discrimination on the basis of race, sex, marital status, pregnancy, national origin, physical disabilities, criminal record, political activity, religion, creed or opinion, in all decisions affecting admissions, membership in school-sponsored organizations, clubs or activities, access to facilities, distribution of funds, academic evaluations or any other aspect of school-sponsored activities. Any limitations with regard to participation in a school-sponsored activity will be based on criteria reasonably related to that specific activity.

In addition, the Board of Education directs its certificated staff members to continue to identify, evaluate and place all disabled children residing in the District in the most appropriate and least restrictive educational program to the best of its financial ability.

The Board further directs its certificated staff to follow the due process procedures, which have been adopted by the State Board of Education.
