Option #1

- 1. Choose 20 TOTAL activities from the packet. Try to choose a few activities from each board.
- 2. Complete an activity and color in the square.
- 3. Choose 5 of the 20 and provide evidence of completion. This can include:
 - *photos (have someone take a picture of you writing your sight words with sidewalk chalk)
 - *drawings (draw a picture of yourself reading to your stuffed animal)
 - *writing samples (turn in the scary story you wrote)

Option #2

Go to one of the libraries listed below and get a welcome packet for *their* summer reading program. They will give you a signed certificate after you have completed the program. Then simply return that certificate to school as proof of your hard work.

Option #3

If you are involved in 4H and complete a special interest project, your book completion can count towards the Summer Reading Challenge. You will need to bring your completed project book to school to show as proof. It must be a special interest project you completed THIS summer (not a previous year's project). Books should not be completed by parents and must be in YOUR HANDWRITING to count. The book will be returned to you.

WARNING! We have high expectations for this challenge. Students must TURN IN ALL 3 CHOICE BOARDS AND 5 PIECES OF EVIDENCE, THE CERTIFICATE FROM THE LIBRARY, or the 4H SPECIAL INTEREST PROJECT BOOK by Friday, August 25th. Late papers will not be accepted. A note from parents stating they completed the activities will not be accepted. We are expecting our students to truly earn this wonderful reward by showing proof of what they did and demonstrating responsibility by turning it in.

Within the first few weeks of school, students that complete this challenge will be rewarded with bounce houses and a snow cone.
