

### No cell phones/smart watches

## HS Credit Requirements

A total of 26 credits are required for graduation from National Trail High School:

- 4.0 Credits in English
- 4.0 Credits in Mathematics (including Algebra II)
- 3.0 Credits in Science
- 3.0 Credits in Social Studies (World, American & Government)
- .5 Credits in Physical Education (2 ¼ credits classes)
- .5 Credits in Health
- 2.0 Credits in Business/Computer
- 1.0 Credit in a Unified Art

**Unified Arts include:** Art, Music, Any Agriculture Class, French, Spanish, Business/Computer, Family and Consumer Science, or Graphic Design class

1.0 Credit in a Fine Art

**Fine Arts include:** Band, Steel Band, Choir, Guitar, Music Appreciation, Art and Graphic Design

- 7.0 Elective Credits (CTC students 5 credits)

### What is a Credit?

#### • How do you gain a credit?

- Semester 1 AVERAGE + Semester 2 AVERAGE = Final Grade
- Final Grade of 60% or Higher = Credit
- What is a semester exam (20% of final grade)

### "Retention" Policy

- 5 credits to be promoted to the 10th grade
- 11 credits to be promoted to the 11th grade
- 17 credits to be promoted to the 12th grade

- Summer school
- In schedule
- Credit Recovery Last resort

# Graduation Requirements Class of 2025 and Beyond

#### 1st: Cover the basics

Meet graduation requirements (26 credits)

#### 2nd: Show competency

- Earn a passing score on Ohio's high school Algebra I and English II tests OR
- Option 1- Demonstrate two career-focused activities
  - Option 2- Enlist in the military
  - Option 3- Complete college coursework in math or english

#### 3rd: Show readiness

• Earn two diploma seals that line up with your goals and interests. At least one of the two must be Ohio-design.

# Parent/Teacher/Admin Partnership

- We are all here for the same goal to get your student a diploma.
- Communication is KEY
  - Email
  - Phone Calls
  - Conferences
- If there is an issue...
  - ...in class, start with the teacher
  - ...with a coach/advisor, contact them first
  - ...with peers, contact Mr. Herring
- If the issue is not resolved with the teacher/advisor, call/email Mr. Herring. For coaches, contact Mr. Ferguson.

### How we can work together

- Help your student get to bed at a decent hour sleep is key for learning!
- Communicate your concerns & vice-versa email and phone calls are helpful if there is an issue.
- Follow grades on Moodle/ABRE these are updated weekly
  - If you need logins & passwords, contact the HS Office
- Keep an eye on your child's cell phone activity
  - This is where we see the most harassment/bullying
- Let us know if you see changes in behavior & vice versa
- Encourage them to be involved in some way
  - Clubs, the arts, athletics, etc.
- Help them set short-, mid-, and long-term goals

### Discipline

- Three common disciplinary outcomes
  - Detention (most common)
  - ISD In School Detention
  - Out of School Suspension
- Detention runs from 2:35-3:30pm they must get their own ride home
- ISD is in the Credit Recovery Room and monitored by Mr.
   Moore
- OSS is a last resort and reserved for significant disciplinary issues
- If ISD or Suspension is used, you will hear from me


